And now?

Let's take action!

Fighting the climate crisis is a collective task, with responsibility unevenly distributed. Every single contribution we make in our daily lives matters. Likewise, medium- and long-term decisions, such as housing choices or vehicle purchases, are part of this. That's why it's important not to wait for others but simply to get started. If we join forces, for example in energy communities, it can be easier and faster, and ultimately even cheaper.

However, different lifestyles also require the right conditions, which must be created by politics. These climate-friendly conditions apply to all of us, including businesses. Through elections, we can influence whether climate protection is taken seriously or not. Civil society engagement is also essential to highlight failures and advocate for solutions.

We can no longer afford to wait and hope for technological solutions. Investing in climate protection is much cheaper than paying for the consequences of the climate crisis. We only have this one planet.


We hope that with this exhibition, we have been able to show possibilities for what a shared path toward the world of tomorrow could look like. Such a livable world will bring us much joy.




